Call for papers

The world of museums is characterized by new buildings and extensions; even Egyptian museums have undergone considerable changes during the last decades and in recent years, for example Berlin, Brooklyn, Copenhagen, Florence, Leiden, London, Naples, Turin – to mention just a few.

Often established in existing historical buildings and integrated into multidisciplinary institutions, Egyptian collections display many different appearances and scenarios and fulfill various functions in their locality's cultural and educational scene.

The CIPEG Conference 2015 will primarily be a forum for the discussion of recent developments and projects for the future, but also for the presentation of historical changes in Egyptian museums. Attention should also be given to current trends in the field of temporary exhibitions.

A special workshop will review the interaction of object, design and architecture, including practical aspects such as labelling, lighting and the application of digital media.

A museological tour through various newly-built or refurbished museums will embed the theme into a broader scope.

Participants are invited to submit papers (short abstracts) which will be reviewed for their integration into a structured program concentrating on the main theme of the conference.

Accommodation

Participants make their own arrangements. The “Maxvorstadt”, the museum’s neighbourhood, has several hotels to choose from.

Travelling

Participants of the International Conference of Egyptologists in Florence, Italy (23rd – 30th of August 2015) can travel to Munich by flight (1h 20 min.), by train (7 h.) or by car (650km, 7 h.). A charter bus for a group of participants might also be an interesting option.

This year’s host:

The new State Museum of Egyptian Art Munich was inaugurated in June 2013. Its concept revolves primarily around art, especially sculpture; however, there are also special galleries devoted to “Egypt in Rome”, “Nubia and Sudan” and “After the Pharaohs” (so-called Coptic art.)

Aside from a large pylon-like entrance wall, the museum building is invisible, situated under a huge lawn. Nevertheless, the sculpture-halls receive daylight through an atrium-like inner court. The architecture follows a predetermined, detailed museological concept. Content, architecture, exhibition design and lighting constitute an interactive entity dominated by the artworks. Its extensive digital information systems are subordinated to the overall aesthetic atmosphere of the galleries.

Situated in the centre of the “Kunstareal”, a concentration of world-famous art museums ranging from ancient to contemporary art, the Egyptian Museum is the only museum of non-European art, expanding our vision of art in both time and space.
